Bologna (Emilia-Romagna - Italy)













Dear Partners:

Following is a brief description of what you need to know having arrived in an Italian airport.

Currency

One of the first things to do right after you have landed successfully in an Italian airport and gone through the passport control is getting some cash money in local currency (EUR). You can get the approximate exchange rate following this link http://www.oanda.com/convert/classic

We recommend exchanging some already at the airport because public transports accept only cash (EUR). Banks and post offices are the most reliable places to change money and generally offer the best rates; shop around for the lowest commission deals. Credit cards are widely accepted in Italy and the exchange rate is usually better than for cash or travellers cheques. If you happen to arrive late in the afternoon banks are closed. Apart from that, payment cards are accepted widely in hotels, stores, restaurants.

Transportation

By plane:

Bologna airport

Guglielmo Marconi airport, northwest of the city at Borgo Panigale, is serviced mainly by European airlines. You can fly in from Rome, Venice, Pisa, Frankfurt, Paris and London, among others. ATC Aerobus connects the city with the airport and leaves from in front of the train station roughly every 15 or 20 minutes until midnight.

Forli airport

Budget carrier Ryanair flies into Forli, 70km southeast of Bologna. The airport is serviced by local buses that coincide with flights.

By train:

Bologna is a major railway junction for regional centres and northern Italy, with frequent services from Rome and Milan, many of them Eurostar trains.

By bus:

Bus services to regional centres such as Ravenna, Ferrara and Modena leave from the depot opposite Piazza XX Settembre, around the corner from the train station. There are also buses to Ancona and Milan, and international buses to Amsterdam, Paris, London, Brussels, Prague and Warsaw.

By car:

If travelling by car, you can reach Bologna on the A1 Autostrada del Sole, which also links Milan, Florence and Rome. The A13 heads directly for Ferrara, Padova and Venezia, the A14 for Rimini and Ravenna, and the Via Emilia (S9), goes on to connect Milan with the Adriatic coast. The S64 leads to Ferrara.

If you want to hire a car, you'll find all of the major hire companies have offices in the city, most also have outlets at the airport.

How to move in Bologna:

The best way to move in Bologna city centre is walking.

Bologna has an efficient bus system, run by ATC; you'll find information booths at the train station and on Via Marconi at the junction with Via Ugo Bassi and Via Lame. There are frequent buses from the train station to the city centre. Not all bus routes operate on Sunday. Taxis are also freely available. http://www.atc.bo.it/english/index.asp

Weather conditions

During spring, the temperatures are pleasant and there are relatively few crowds.

Wear spring clothing and a sweater at night but also remember your raincoat and umbrella. The temperature in May is around +22 C in the late morning.

Bologna

Bologna offers a chance to rest and savour. Surrounded by hills, the city's centre is still much as it was during the Renaissance: dusky red-coloured buildings, wide piazzas and arched porticoes with floors laid with marble.

Places to see:

Basilica di San Petronio











City centre

Named after the city's patron saint, work commenced on the basilica in 1392 but, for political reasons, was never finished.

Hours: 7:30am-1:30pm, 2:30pm-6:00pm

Basilica di Santo Stefano

City centre

The Basilica di Santo Stefano is a group of four churches remaining from an original seven.

Hours: 9:00am-12:15pm & 3:30pm-6:30pm

<u>University of Bologna</u> (established in 1088)

City centre, Via Zamboni

Basilica Santuario della Madonna di San Luca

This hill-top sanctuary is visible on a clear day from most parts of Bologna.

The basilica, built in the 18th century, is connected to the city walls by the world's longest portico, or covered walkway, made up of 666 arches

Hours: 7:00am-7:12am, 2:30pm-7:00pm










Bologna city centre map
